Our starting point is that, while crises are widely studied, the concept of returning to normalcy remains underexplored, particularly regarding the discourses, practices, and imaginaries associated with these transitions. All of the program's presentations focus on the media's role in constructing narratives, exerting political influence, enabling resistance movements, shaping individual experiences, fueling populist rhetoric, and framing national identity conflicts. Ultimately, the conference seeks to understand how media and political discourses construct post-crisis realities and contribute to shaping collective perception.
