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In 1990, Dodgy Pharma (DP), a corporation based in New York and incorporated in Virginia, began producing and marketing OxyOkay. OxyOkay is a powerful opioid, which was initially intended to treat very severe pain. Its use can lead to serious side-effects and addiction, and there is a risk of overdose. Patients must be physically examined by a doctor every time they need a new prescription.

It is alleged that from 1999 onwards, Dodgy Pharma began aggressively marketing OxyOkay, encouraging doctors to prescribe it to patients who were not in severe pain. The company deliberately played down the risk of addiction and overdose, and also encouraged dangerously high doses. Misbranding a drug in this way is a felony under federal and state law. The Head of Marketing during this period was Angela Ashcroft. The CEO of Dodgy Pharma, Barbara Biggins, claims that she was unaware of the marketing strategy.

One doctor who was targeted by Dodgy Pharma's marketing team was Dr Christina Cunningham, from Chicago, Illinois. In 2005, around the time that Dr Cunningham began prescribing OxyOkay, Dodgy Pharma bought her a new Mercedes-Benz. In 2009, when she was prescribing OxyOkay in large quantities, they renovated her clinic.

By 2016, most of the doctors in Illinois had stopped prescribing OxyOkay because of the high levels of addiction and death caused, and Dr Cunningham told Dodgy Pharma that she also wanted to stop. She states that two representatives from the company then told her that if she did not continue to prescribe the drug, her clinic would be burned down and she would be shot. Between 2016 and 2018 Dr Cunningham prescribed high doses of OxyOkay to more than a thousand patients. In many cases she did not physically examine the patient. Many were addicts, who drove hundreds of miles to her clinic.

Elizabeth Evans was prescribed OxyOkay by Dr Cunningham several times in 2018. She was a resident of Illinois. Evans died in August 2018 of an overdose of OxyOkay. She had a five year-old son who is disabled. Her family wish to sue Dodgy Pharma under state law, and are seeking damages.

Residents for a Safer Chicago (RSC) is an association with members living in Chicago, including around Dr Cunningham's clinic. There has been an increase in crime in the area which they blame on Dr Cunningham's clinic. They filed suit against Dr Cunningham in June 2018 under a federal statute (18 USC § 1964), seeking an injunction ordering the closure of Dr Cunningham's clinic.

Stop Opioid Abuse Now (SOAN) is an association with members across the USA. Members include ex-OxyOkay addicts and close relatives of those who have died due to OxyOkay use. They file for an injunction under a federal statute (18 USC § 1964) to stop Dodgy Pharma marketing OxyOkay for anything other than the most serious pain.

Dr Cunningham's clinic closed in September 2018. She stated that the closure was to allow her to deal with the legal cases against her.

Answer the following questions. Use up to 500 words for each question.

A) Discuss subject-matter and personal jurisdiction in relation to all the civil suits mentioned above. Discuss any issues of justiciability which may arise from these suits. (50 marks)

B) What criminal cases may arise from these facts? Consider all possible offences. Include discussion of jurisdiction and potential defences. (50 marks)
